"Make It MINE"






Effect change in the narrative of misconceptions and misperceptions about the most affected populations of children caught and funneled through the preschool to prison pipeline and engender understanding in the broader community that criminalizing child behavior is contradictory to creating better outcomes

- Promote acknowledgment of systemic racism, poverty and trauma as primary contributors to the pipeline
- Engage in intentional actions that address systemic racism, poverty and trauma for better outcomes for all children and families
 - promote best practices
 - change the language







As a community, we need to:

- o Insist that our local school boards and administrators replace discriminatory discipline with restorative justice practices and to prioritize the funding of student support services over law enforcement. Since we know that many of our children suffer from Adverse Childhood Experiences and trauma, they and their families would be better served by school counselors, social workers, school nurses and child psychologists.
- Advocate for the governor and state legislature to fully fund the implementation of positive discipline practices (with fidelity), such as CHINS, PBIS, restorative justice and social-emotional learning programming in all public schools.
- Require that all school personnel are trained in traumainformed practices; cultural competencies and appreciation; and implicit bias awareness.
- Engage teachers, parents, students, faith community leaders and other community leaders to actively participate in promoting school safety that depends less on law enforcement.
- Push for all of the above to be included as accountability measures in school and district improvement plans and the state's School Climate Rating.








- Get involved in the campaign challenge to "Make It MINE!" Mobilize, Inform, Network, Engage

Create partnerships



Be an information gatherer


- Cultural awareness education

- Develop an accountability and impact measurement tool that tracks the work being done and the impact on the issue








- Volunteer or mentor at your local school. See what is going on--help students with addressing the underlying causes of their "misbehavior."
